BRING A GUEST



This is one of the stories I tell school children during my flag program. Almost everyone has heard of Paul Revere, but rarely has anyone heard of William Dawes, and he was the one who was responsible for the British Army being called out. He and his friends had stolen a couple of cannons from the British and they were later buried and therefore hidden in the rows of corn on Col. Barret's farm located north of Concord. This is why the British Army crossed the Old North Bridge where the "Shot heard around the world" was fired. This was the most unbelievable event of the colonies to that time. Here was a group of men who were not organized, had no real government at that time, and they opened fire on the most powerful military in the world!
