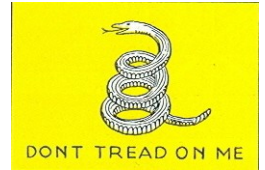

The following information is from the 1958 edition of the World Book Encyclopedia, volume 6.

“FLAG DAY is June 14. It is the anniversary of the day on which the Continental Congress adopted the Flag of the United States in 1777. Homes, business establishments, and public buildings display the Flag. Special programs are held, featuring patriotic music and discussions about the Flag’s meaning and origin.

Flag Day is not an official national holiday, but it is observed by Presidential proclamation. It is a legal holiday in Pennsylvania. Flag Day was first officially celebrated in 1877, when congress requested that the Flag be flown from all public buildings. In 1885, Bernard J. Cigrand (1866 - 1932), a school teacher of Waubeka, Wis., began a lifetime of effort for a yearly national observance of Flag Day. He is sometimes called the “Father of Flag Day”. “

In order to do things in a decent and orderly manner, I am setting aside the first Tuesday of each month to publish the Coast Dispatch. [I have the President’s permission to do this.] In order to help me accomplish that, I would ask that all items anyone would want in the Coast Dispatch be in my hands on or before the Friday before the first Tuesday of the month. This way everyone will know when the Coast Dispatch will be published and can act accordingly.

In many cases, there is room for more information in the Dispatch, if anyone wishes to publish something about their Patriot or some other Revolutionary era subject, it would be appreciated. Items submitted by email would receive first priority, typed, double spaced articles would receive second priority. Hope the hear from you.
